INTRODUCTION

This is a CRITICAL INCIDENT activity.

Your teacher should have assigned you to a specific work-group which could interact through a forum on the e-learning platform.

Follow the instructions and interact in the "CRITICAL INCIDENT" forum of this Module.

The activity envisages 4 main steps, described below.

The schedule of each step will be described by the teacher in the message that will open the activity in the forum of your group.

STEPS OF THE ACTIVITY

STEP 1: Identification of a critical incident

Identify an incident or a particular problematic situation concerning **OLDER ADULTS ABUSE** which you consider significant to your role as Home Health Care Practitioner (HHCP). The incident should have occurred in your **homecare activity** at work or during your traineeship or work-based learning, apprenticeship, etc.

STEP 2: Presentation of your "learning log"

Now you have present your "learning log" for the identified critical incident. A *learning log* is a record of learning opportunities presented in terms of personal reflections.

Presenting your learning log you have to:

- I. DESCRIBE THE INCIDENT: describe the above identified incident in terms of what happened, when, where and how without revealing names
- II. IDENTIFY ATTRIBUTES: identify the special attributes or aspects of this incidents that sets it apart from all the others in your experience
- III. REFLECT: reflect on what happened in terms of the learning gained for you as HHCP in the context of homecare.

You have **TO WRITE THIS PRESENTATION DOWN**, producing a document (max 1 page) and taking into account that your learning log should:

- ✓ help you remember what happened as part of that critical incident;
- ✓ explain to you and others reading it, why you did what you did;
- \checkmark evaluate your action and that of others who were involved in the incident;
- ✓ outline what you should or shouldn't have done, in retrospect;
- ✓ how you would behave given a similar incident in the future;
- ✓ describe what you believe you learned from that critical incident.



Then **UPLOAD the document in the forum** your working group.

STEP 3: Discussing learning logs

Now you have to discuss and comment about the learning logs presented by the other students.

Send a comment for each learning log replying directly to the message sent by your colleague.

STEP 4: Summary reflection linking the theory with the practice

Now your group have to produce a 'summary reflection' linking the theory with the practice.

You should discuss in the forum:

- how to produce it
- the main contents of the document.

You should focus on:

- ✓ the extent to which you feel that the theory (what you learned in this unit) helped you cope with the critical incident you encountered at work;
- ✓ the adequacies and inadequacies of your theoretical knowledge base with regard to your performance during that critical incident;
- ✓ the enlightenment you may have gained from reflecting on the learning logs of your peers and the reflections of your peers on your own learning log.

Assessment

- Step 2 quality of your learning log document: 5 out of 10 points
- Step 3 contribution to the discussion: 3 out of 10 points
- Step 4 quality of the final collaborative document: 2 out of 10 points
